This award recognizes industry veterans who exhibit exemplary leadership, service, and industry contribution in the performance of their duties and as a member of the communities they serve. To be eligible to receive this award, nominees must have served in a parking, transportation and/or mobility position for 10 years or more.



Frequently Asked Questions

If my entry is the only one in a category, will I win by default?

If your entry reaches the established threshold after judging, then yes! With this threshold in place, IPMI ensures that high-caliber entries will be recognized.

Can I resubmit a previous entry?

Yes. If the project wasn't chosen for an award, you may update the entry and resubmit if it meets the eligibility requirements.

Are there eligibility requirements for Emerging Leader of the Year or James M. Hunnicutt, CAPP, Industry Professional of the Year nominees?

Yes. Emerging Leader of the Year nominees must be 40 years of age or younger as of December 31, 2024. James M. Hunnicutt, CAPP, Industry Professional of the Year nominees must have served in a parking, transportation and/or mobility position for 10 years or more and in a leadership or volunteer position for IPMI or affiliated state and regional association in the past five years. Additional eligibility guidelines are included in the criteria for each award.

Can I submit two people from my organization for the same award?

We suggest that you only enter one person from your organization in a category. If entered in the same, these people compete against each other. You may be able to submit one in a similar category; review the descriptions to determine eligibility. Aside from the Organization of the Year award, Professional Recognition Awards are individual awards that recognize one person. Submissions that nominate two people in the same entry will not be considered.

Could there be more than one person or organization awarded in each category?

If multiple entries achieve the highest threshold, multiple people or organizations may be recognized.

How long is the narrative for each submittal?

Submissions for Professional Excellence Awards or Emerging Leader of the Year and Organization of the Year are limited to 1,250, with a limit of 250 words per section. Submissions for James M. Hunnicutt, CAPP, Industry Professional of the Year are limited to 1,500 words, with each section limited to 300 words.

Evaluations and Judging

Submissions are evaluated and ranked by the IPMI Professional Recognition Awards judges. Our volunteer judges are fielded from professionals in the parking, transportation, and mobility industry from every sector, bringing a wealth of experience and diverse perspectives to the evaluation process.

- Summary: Describe the nominee and role within the organization demonstrating excellence in a parking, transportation, and/or mobility position at the time of the nomination, demonstrating a minimum of two years and exceptional leadership. (20%)
- Organization Culture, Leadership, and Staffing: Describe the nominee's professional reputation and relationship with staff, patrons, and colleagues. (20%)
- Strategic Planning and Technology Application: Demonstrate the nominee's application of creative solutions, innovation, and best practices. (20%)
- Examples of Nominee's Specific Expertise: Provide at least three specific examples of the nominee's professional contributions related to the category selected. (20%)

Community and Industry Contributions: Describe nominee's contribution to the parking, transportation, and mobility industry through service and leadership in community engagement and

professional development. Demonstrate service and contributions to IPMI and/ or its affiliates, including but not limited to volunteer positions and contribution through authorship,speaking opportunities, and/or special projects and initiatives. Demonstrate service and contributions outside of the industry. This may include civic and charitable organizations, and leadership or service in associations or groups outside of industry. (20%)

Organization of the Year Entry Requirements and Criteria by Category

This award recognizes an organization that demonstrates comprehensive operational excellence across a wide range of areas, including organizational culture, customer service, innovation, and more.

Eligibility Requirements

- Nominee has demonstrated commitment to advancing unique and innovative ideas and creativity across the organization.
- Nominee demonstrates documented standards of excellence in customer service, operations, finance, human resources, professional development, marketing, and more

Nomination Requirements

Narrative demonstrating the following characteristics and criteria. Each section limited to 250 words, for a total of 1,250 words:

- Organization Overview: Provide a list or summary of programs and services, as well as statistics and figures that describe the volume, size, efficiency, and services provided by the organization. (20%)
- Programs and Services: Description of three or more programs and services, including program goals and outcomes and benchmarking and other data to document program success. Share how a program/service has been successful, and/or describe a difficult challenge and how the organization addressed that challenge. (20%)

Include contributions and partnerships with IPMI, its affiliates, and the greater community, including participation in the Accredited Parking Organization (APO) and CAPP Certification programs, volunteer contributions supported by the organization including but not limited to participation in State and Regional Associations, other civic or charity organizations, authorship, speaking opportunities, and/or special projects and initiatives (20%).

This award recognizes industry veterans who exhibit exemplary leadership, service, and industry contribution in the performance of their duties and as a member of the communities they serve.

Eligibility Requirements

- Served in a parking, transportation and/or mobility position for 10 years or more.
- Served in a leadership or volunteer position for IPMI or affiliated state and regional association in the past five years.
- Demonstrates civic engagement and/or volunteerism outside of the parking, transportation, and mobility industry in the past five years.

Nomination Requirements

Complete Contact information for Nominator and Nominee Narrative demonstrating the following achievements according to criteria requirements. Each section of the narrative is limited to 300 words, for a total of 1,500 words:

- Summary: Describe the nominee and role within the organization demonstrating excellence in parking, transportation, and/or mobility positions at the time of the nomination (minimum of ten years' industry service). (20%)
- Organization Culture, Leadership, and Staffing: Describe the nominee's professional reputation and relationship with staff, patrons, and colleagues. (20%)
- Strategic Planning and Technology Application: Demonstrate the nomi-

nee's application of creative solutions, innovation, and best practices. (20%)

- Expertise and Impact: Describe extraordinary contribution to the parking, transportation, and mobility industry, include details describing industry impacts and outcomes. (20%)
- **Community and Industry** Contributions: Describe contribution to the parking, transportation, and mobility industry through service and leadership in community engagement and professional development (20%). Demonstrate service and contributions to IPMI and/or its affiliates, including but not limited to volunteer positions and contribution through authorship, speaking opportunities, and/or special projects and initiatives. Demonstrate service and contributions outside of the industry. This may include civic and charitable organizations, and leadership or service in associations or groups outside of industry. (20%)
